The cost is approximately \$68 and the family contributes \$25 to \$30 of the charge. It is a good opportunity to reward students for making good decisions. Mike Ziegler spoke about the students that spoke at the Site Visit and their view is that all students at the high school should be drug tested. The Board of Education will continue to examine the program.

D. BBHCSD – Revised Tobacco policy

- i. Meredith Ondak reported that Brecksville-Broadview Heights City Schools has a Board policy about being 100% tobacco free. There was a discussion about the placement of the signage that was purchased. There are ten available signs. There were a number of possible locations identified.
